Purpose Statement: To provide a safe, welcoming and nurturing, age-appropriate environment for children ages newborn to pre-kindergarten in the Early Childhood ministry area. Inspiring kids to know, love and follow Jesus is our mission in all that we do.

Job Description:

Essential Functions:

- Proactively greet and engage with parents as the Sunday Service Coordinator
 - Listen to parents for special instructions
 - Check babies through preschoolers in and out adhering to policies set in place for drop off and pick up
 - Register new families
 - o Direct families to appropriate room and small group leader
 - Act as security during service by being available and seen in the hallway
 - Make extra copies of lesson crafts if needed
 - Prep materials for future lessons
 - Message parents, if needed, during service
- Engage with preschoolers as a Group Leader
 - Engage preschoolers in small group activities and crafts
 - Lead group in lesson with either video or props
 - o Be mindful of the time and transition preschoolers when and where they should be
 - Worship with group by singing and performing motions
 - Help individuals with using the restroom following safety guidelines
 - Read and follow information on name labels (allergies, special instructions)
- Follow all Early Childhood safety and protocol rules
 - Read and follow the Child and Youth Safety Policy and Procedures Manual
 - o Follow guidelines for sick children in the Early Childhood area
 - Clean and sanitize used toys after each service
- Function as a team within the Early Childhood staff and volunteers
 - Help volunteers to feel welcome by interacting with them, answering their questions and directing them to correct locations and small group leaders
 - Attend Early Childhood staff meetings/trainings mini training sessions before each Sunday service and other training meetings 2-3 times per year

- Passion for serving God and our church body through ministering to babies through preschoolers and their families;
- Good organizational skills;
- High moral character and good attendance record;
- Proven character of honesty and integrity;

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

What we believe about God and His Word:

- 1. We believe in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament as verbally inspired by God and inerrant in the original writings and that they are of supreme and final authority in faith and life. (2 Tim. 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20, 21)
- 2. We believe in one God, eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (Is. 43:10; Titus 3:4; Matt. 3:13-17, 28:19)
- 3. We believe that Jesus Christ was begotten by the Holy Spirit, was born of the Virgin Mary, and is true God and true man. (Matt. 1:20-23; Phil. 2:5-9; Is. 7:14)
- 4. We believe in the resurrection of the crucified body of the Lord, in His ascension into Heaven, and in His present life there for us as High Priest and Advocate. (John 20:1-16; Acts 1:9; Heb. 4:14-16)

What we believe about man and salvation:

What we believe about eternity and our destiny:

- 11. We believe in "that blessed hope," the personal and imminent coming of our Lord into the air for His saints. (1 Thess. 4:16-18; Acts 1:11)
- 12. We believe in the bodily resurrection of the just and the unjust, the everlasting blessedness of the saved and the everlasting punishment of the lost. (1 Cor. 15:51-54; Rev. 20:15)
- 13. We believe that Satan, a fallen angel, is the god of this age, the adversary of Christ and His Church, and that his destiny is eternal punishment. (2 Cor. 4:4; Rev. 20:10)
